## March 20th Meeting



Gavin Glakas shared his love of painting with us at the March OAA meeting. First he spoke about his journey to become a full time artist, a path that was discouraged by many of the artists he admired. Then he demonstrated his approach to beginning a portrait.

**Bio** Gavin Glakas grew up in Bethesda, Maryland and studied at Washington University in St. Louis and the Slade School of Fine Art in London.

Following graduation, Glakas worked for a year as an illustrator in Greece and then a year and a half on Capitol Hill for Sen. Harry Reid. He had planned to go to law school, but after an eight-month illness which culminated in the removal of a tumor from his lung at the age of 24, he decided to pursue his lifelong ambition of a career as an artist.

Glakas began showing his work in galleries almost immediately and has won numerous honors for his artwork, including awards from the Portrait Society of America and the Butler Institute of American Art. His paintings have been featured in American Art Collector, International Artist, and Art Business News magazines and exhibited at museums and galleries throughout the country.

Glakas' portraits hang in the United States Capitol, Georgetown University, the Ratner Museum, and the Society of the Four Arts Museum in Palm Beach, as well as numerous private collections.

The artist lives in Washington D.C., where he paints fulltime and also teaches figure painting and drawing at the Yellow Barn Studio in Glen Echo, MD.

## May 6th Meeting

At the next OAA meeting we will discuss the upcoming **Sandy Spring Museum Show** and the **Olney Library Exhibit**. Our presenter will be Liliane Blom, a classically trained painter and award winning photographer whose distinct style mixes her love of both media into a new one. She calls her fusion of painting and photography digital painting. Her pieces printed on canvas or watercolor paper are later enhanced with oils/pastels and often with gold or silver leaf. Based in Rock-ville Maryland of French/Norwegian extraction she is a frequent exhibitor in the Washington region. A poet at heart, she often incorporates words into her work.

## Kritt's Tip

### **Tips from Penny Kritt Painting Textures**

Whether you want to paint or draw bricks, a shiny silver teapot or a child's hair glowing in the sun, a few simple rules will get you exactly what you want every time!

The artist's biggest and best tool is always the use of value contrasts and the transition from one value to another. Value simply means anything from light to dark, from black through gray to white. No color? Sure! Think about all those glorious black and white photos. White, black and all the grays in between are all you need, so those who draw get off easy. Color also has value, of course. So for all you painters, think about how a powder blue is a lighter value than navy blue.

Then the only other thing to consider is how you get from one value to another. Will you have a hard edge, a soft edge or a gradual transition? That's it, that's all you have to know!

Drawing or painting tree bark usually means mid tones and darks with hard or soft edges, depending on how prominent the grain is in the bark. All you need is a few highlights that aren't too light.



Not much value contrast, mostly soft edges.

Hair or fur uses the same concepts. The shinier the hair or your pet's coat, the bigger the value contrasts. Almost all the edges on interior value shapes will be soft. Don't try to use brush strokes to paint individual hairs, just use the value shape you need to reflect light or shadow and make the edges soft.



### Use dark values right against the face

When doing large shapes of brick or stone, don't worry about making each brick or rock a distinct unit. Put in the general color, hint at a few details and then move on! Notice that the grout lines sometimes disappear and the color of the individual bricks is mottled.



Paint the brick wall, not individual bricks Happy painting!


