Edvard Munch: Color in Context, National Gallery of Art, West Building, Ground Floor, September 3, 2017 – January 28, 2018. In the second half of the 19th century, advances in physics, electromagnetic radiation theory, and the optical sciences provoked new thought about the physical as well as the spiritual world. Aspects of that thought are revealed in Edvard Munch: Color in Context, an exhibition of 21 prints that considers the choice, combinations, and meaning of color in light of spiritualist principles.

Posing for the Camera: Gifts from Robert B. Menschel, National Gallery of Art, West Building, Ground Floor, September 17, 2017 – January 28, 2018. A selection of some 60 photographs in the Gallery's collection made possible by Robert B. Menschel are on view in an exhibition that examines how the act of posing for a portrait changed with the invention of the medium. Featured works come from the early 1840s—just after photography was invented—through the 1990s. The exhibition includes pictures by Lewis Carroll, Edward Weston, Man Ray, Robert Frank, Timothy H. O'Sullivan, and Brassaï, in addition to photographs by scientists, commercial practitioners, and amateurs.

Renoir and Friends, Luncheon of the Boating Party, at the Phillips Collection, 1600 21st Street, NW Washington DC. October 7, 2017 - January 7, 2018. Subject Matter: Must be botanical in nature, i.e. landscapes, florals, trees etc. (no portraits or people in the painting). Abstracts are acceptable but botanicals are preferred. Please note thatBrookside reserves the right to reject any work they feel does not meet their standards.

There are no size restrictions for framed paintings. Wrap around canvas is allowed IF the edges are painted and look professional. All paintings must have screw eyes and wire for hanging, and be labeled on the back with:

ARTIST NAME TITLE, MEDIUM, DIMENSIONS, PRICE. (NOTE: no personal information i.e. phone, address etc. is allowed)

Bin Work Up to (5) pieces of bin work per exhibiting artist may be submitted. Size of bin work should be no smaller than 8' x 10" and no larger than 16" x 20". They must be matted, placed in a clear bag and labeled on the back with TITLE, MEDIUM, DIMENSIONS, PRICE and ARTIST'S NAME.

(NOTE: no personal information: phone, address etc. is allowed)

Sales: All sales will be handled by the Brookside Gardens Gift Shop. After the exhibit has ended, artists who have sold work will receive a check from Brookside Gardens, minus a 25% commission.

OAA takes no commission from this exhibit.

Entry Fee To be determined.



Highlights versus Glare

Not every item you paint has to be photorealistic. Sometimes, "good enough" is just right. All you needed was for the viewer to get the idea. But there's a lot of ground between completely realistic and "you know what I mean".

So let's look at a simple example of some of the gradations along the way.



Grape No. 1 is just a plain purple oval, but that may be good enough, especially if there's a banana right next to it.

Grape No. 2 goes further by adding an indication of a bright light source and a hint of a shadow underneath. Notice how different I did the indication of light versus the shadow. That light shape is what "glare" looks like. It's a stark white value contrast with hard edges. The shadow at

the bottom is just the opposite with a soft version of a "lost edge". You can't really tell where the grape stops and the shadow begins, hence the "lost" quality. Also as the shadow moves away from the grape, it gets lighter and the edges get even softer.

Our third grape also has a glare for a highlight. This time the highlight is butted right up against the dark shadow of grape No. 5 and the stark value contrast is almost painful to look at because it strains your eyes. The bottom of this grape only has a soft edge instead of one that gradually lightens as it moves away from the grape.

With grape No. 4, we're getting closer to realism. Instead of a white glare, we now have a highlight that is a lighter value of the base color of the grape and its edges are very soft.

The fifth grape is very similar to No. 4 except that the highlight is even lighter than in the previous one and it shows that the light source is now on the right. Especially if you're doing a painting of a daytime scene, there can be multiple sources of light, but choose one as the primary source to keep your highlights and shadows on the same side for each object.

We finally get to the "pull out all the stops" with grape No. 6. Again, there is a pink highlight instead of a glare and it has shadows both at the bottom and on the right side. Particularly with red grapes, there is often a green or brown cast. Because there is no green elsewhere, it sticks out like a sore thumb. Solve that problem by adding *more* green instead of getting rid of the first application!


