Reception and Awards Ceremony, Sunday, June 24, 2-4 p.m. Located at 12901 Town Commons Drive Germantown, Maryland 20874 Jackson Pollock's "Mural", National Gallery of Art, East Building, Lipper Level – Bridge, November 19

East Building, Upper Level – Bridge. November 19, 2017 – October 28, 2018, A special installation in the Gallery's East Building features Mural (1943) by Jackson Pollock, on Ioan from the University of Iowa Museum of Art. Originally commissioned by Peggy Guggenheim for her New York City townhouse, the early painting is Pollock's largest work at nearly 20 feet long, and represents a major

turning point in the seminal artist's career and style. Also on view are paintings and works on paper by Pollock from the Gallery's collection, including Number 1, 1950 (Lavender Mist) (1950). The installation marks the debut of "Mural" in Washington, DC.

Cézanne Portraits, National Gallery of Art, West Building, Main Floor, March 25 – July 1, 2018. Cézanne Portraits is the first exhibition devoted to the famed post-impressionist's portraits from across his career. The exhibition explores the unconventional aspects of his portraiture, the role his portraits play in the development of his radical style and method, and the range and influence of his sitters.

Like Riding a Bike

There are a lot of elements that make up an attractive composition, but value contrast (ranging from light to dark) is usually the most important by far. Although we all respond immediately to color, the contrast in light to dark shapes is what creates a strong underlying structure. Consider the power of a well composed black and white photo. In many cases, adding color would be intrusive and detrimental to the emotional content of the image.

It's not just the value of a particular shape. The strength of a composition rests on the contrast – or lack thereof of *consecutive* shapes.

Look at the two color swatches below.

As you can see from the color swatches and their grayscale chart above, although the yellow seems a lot stronger, the lavender is actually a little darker. They make a powerful statement when next to each other, however, because the warm yellow is next to a cooler color. It's the *temperature* contrast that makes them interesting, not one of value.

The colors below are now modified as muted colors; each one has at least a bit of all three primary colors. Which one looks darker? Their grayscale chart below shows that both are just slightly darker than the swatches above.

Were you surprised that the grayscale comparison was almost the same in each case? Although the top yellow is more saturated and closer to a pure yellow, it's still slightly lighter in value compared to the lavender.




Figure 5 (grayscale)




Figure 6 (grayscale)

Now let's look at darker colors. Take a moment to study them and rank them in order of light to dark. The top squares in Figure 5 are purer, brighter colors. Then rank the more muted colors below in Figure 6.



Now make one last determination. Are any of the colors *really* dark, almost black?

OK, let's see how you did.

Of course, colors may vary because of your screen's calibration, whether you view it during daylight hours or under artificial light, etc., but the results should be fairly close.

Generically speaking, most people think warmer colors seem lighter in value while cooler ones appear darker.



Tip for checking value contrasts:

(High tech) Now that so many of us are used to taking photos with our phones, just snap a picture and convert it to grayscale. You can probably do that right on your phone.

(Low tech) I always have a black sharpie marker on my art table. When I'm not sure if a color is *really* dark, I just hold the sharpie's cap next to it. The more you do this, the less often you'll need to do it! Just like riding a bike...

In order to be included and to better streamline this process, all artists who wish to participate will need to follow directions, submit as requested, and respect timelines. Each artist must fill out this entry form and return it to David Terrar, 23663 Rolling Fork Way., Gaithersburg, MD 20882, with the entry fee of \$10 for up to four (4) pieces. In addition, digital images for each piece of artwork entered must be sent as an attachment to an email directly to David in jpeg format, 300 dpi image of the works - email is <u>david_terrar@msn.com</u>

Judith Heartsong, Gallery Director, will serve as juror for all entries and for awards. The awards will be three (3) Juror's Awards and six (6) Honorable Mentions

Sales will be made directly to the artists. Work sold in the exhibit will require a **25%** gallery commission.

Artists are required to fill out and submit a Hold Harmless Form.

Submission Requirements

****Submissions (submission form and emailed jpeg) due on or before July 1, 2018 4pm.

Submission form must be filled out completely, and must be legible. Illegible and incomplete entries will not be considered.

JPEG must be emailed to <u>david terrar@msn.com</u>. Artist must type **A&M** Art Submission and the artist's last name **last name** in the email subject line. *For example: A&M Art Submission, Terrar*. Images should be sized at no more than 1024 by 768 pixels, and less than 1 megabyte in disk space size. **Image file name must include artist's last name and title of the piece in the following format**: (ArtistLastName_ImageTitle.JPG) example: **vanGogh_StarryNight.jpg**.

Work must be properly wired and ready to hang - work not ready to hang will not be shown. Wrapped canvases must be finished on all sides and equipped with a hanging wire. No sawtooth hangers will be permitted. Artist's name and title of piece must be attached to the artwork when delivered to gallery for install.

Work must be delivered to the gallery on July 31 and picked up from the assigned gallery after the exhibit on August 31.

Opening and Reception – August 3, 6-9pm. All members must contribute to the reception in some way – donations of store-prepared foods, beverages, ice, paper products, monetary donation, etc.
