OAA Annual Juried Show at Kentlands Mansion, 320 Kent Square Rd, Gaithersburg, MD 20878. October 27—December 8. Artists' Reception Thursday, November 16, 2017, 7– 8:30 p.m.

Edvard Munch: Color in Context, National Gallery of Art, West Building, Ground Floor, September 3, 2017 – January 28, 2018. In the second half of the 19th century, advances in physics, electromagnetic radiation theory, and the optical sciences provoked new thought about the physical as well as the spiritual world. Aspects of that thought are revealed in Edvard Munch: Color in Context, an exhibition of 21 prints that considers the choice, combinations, and meaning of color in light of spiritualist principles.

Posing for the Camera: Gifts from Robert B. Menschel, National Gallery of Art, West Building, Ground Floor, September 17, 2017 – January 28, 2018. A selection of some 60 photographs in the Gallery's collection made possible by Robert B. Menschel are on view in an exhibition that examines how the act of posing for a portrait changed with the invention of the medium. Featured works come from the early 1840s—just after photography was invented—through the 1990s. The exhibition includes pictures by Lewis Carroll, Edward Weston, Man Ray, Robert Frank, Timothy H. O'Sullivan, and Brassaï, in addition to photographs by scientists, commercial practitioners, and amateurs.

Bin Work: We will be allowing bin work from OAA members who were accepted into the juried show. Like our juried pieces, Kentlands will take 30 percent. We only have one bin for the duration of the show, so each participant can only have two pieces in that bin. The bin will be located in the Art Barn, across the street from our show. However, each artist juried into the show is permitted to bring an additional three pieces to show in bins during the reception. After the reception, those pieces must be removed. All bin work must be properly matted flat works on paper (no canvas) in plastic sleeves, and labeled with the artist's name, medium, title and selling price. The size for bin work is limited to no greater than 20" by 24". Please make sure you complete the bin work sheet provided in email. Any questions, contact one of the co-chairs.

Drop Off Art Work: 23 October 2017 at Kentlands Mansion at 10:30-11:00. If you are unable to drop off your accepted work, please contact a friend in Olney Art Association whom you know was juried into the show, or contact Sandra Cane or Lisa Coddington, co-chairs for the show. If you can deliver your art work to one of us the day before (Sunday), we should be able to deliver the art for you. Tips for Before and After

Whether you're a beginning artist or a seasoned professional, everyone often has that dreaded moment of hesitation before starting a new piece. What if I ruin it? What if the very first mark messes up the whole thing?

Here are some tips to help you over those bumps.

First, be intrepid! If you draw or paint with watercolors or acrylics, it's just a piece of paper. You're rich enough to afford another one if necessary. But you have lots of ways to correct mistakes, even in watercolor, so don't let that generic fear stop you. And if you're working on canvas, just scrape off or paint over any offending areas.

Second, *this piece is one of a series*. It's not your only chance, not a make or break situation. To consider that you only get one shot to get everything right will add a lot of needless pressure. You wouldn't tell a fellow artist that a composition must be exactly right, without mistakes or corrections on the first try. So don't shackle yourself with that concept. Surely you don't imagine that the old masters got it right on the first try, so why should you live under that artificial burden?

Third, take a few minutes to plan for success. Consider what you will paint or draw before you start. Tulips and daffodils are tall and thin. Think how much more interesting it will be to paint just one flower in portrait format (taller than wide) instead of a lot of them in a

garden border in landscape mode. Maybe you want to do a landscape of mountains. Which mountains makes a big difference. The Rockies will be tall and jagged, but the Blue Ridge will be flatter and rounder at the top.

If you aren't sure what something looks like, go to Google.com and select "Images", then just type in what you want. You don't have to use the whole image, maybe just choose the part(s) that suit you.

And finally, every now and then we just get lucky and a perfect image leaps off the page! If you

started your work on a piece of paper that was marked with the *inner* dimensions of a standard insert of a frame, you'll save a fortune! Your paper or canvas must be wider than the insert of the frame so that mat or frame can hold it down, but you'll always save money when you can buy standard frames and mats!

And here's a bonus tip: If you use tape to mark off your edges, always tear it from the inner part of the paper toward the margin, not in the other direction. That way, if the tape is too sticky and rips the paper, that part will be hidden under the mat/frame.
